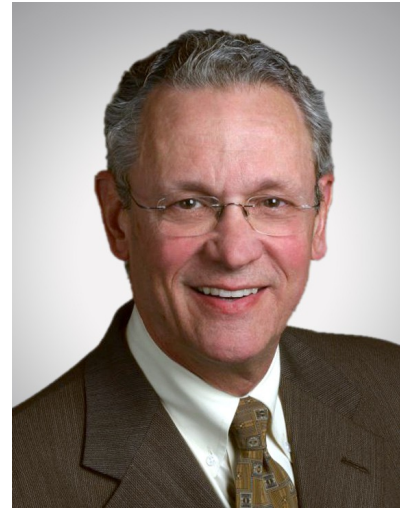


Jeffrey B. Bartell
